Summary-

Project Taaleem in Collaboration with Project Sanskar, NSS, SRCC

Under the rotary field of action which was basic education and literacy, we organised a project which was called Project Taleem because Education is the greatest gift from 1st June 2023.

The project took place in Sri Ram College of College (SRCC) in collaboration with their NSS and was segmented into three distinct events.

1.Captivating Session on Gender Equality: This event aimed to raise awareness and promote discussion about gender equality. It likely included informative talks, presentations, and discussions led by experts in the field. Topics may have included gender stereotypes, women empowerment, equal opportunities, and the importance of gender equality in education and society. Event 1 - Donation Drive

We organised a donation campaign to aid those who have been forced from their homes in Manipur as a result of intercommunal strife. We worked with the North-east cells of more than ten DU Colleges to set up donation booths at their respective colleges. We gathered clothing for around 200 people. Additionally, we gathered medications, more than 500 sanitary napkins, and more than Rs. 15000 in our bank account. We are quite proud to say that we have had a positive influence on more than 10,000 people in Manipur.

Event 2 - Letter of Hopes

To ensure the last day of the event is a memorable and impactful, we embarked on a mission to gather letters of hope from all the participating members. These heartfelt messages will serve as beacons of hope, intended to be sent to the displaced people of Manipur.
