'The Department Council of the Department of Political Science expresses deep misgiving at the enactment of the Four Year Undergraduate Programme without consulting the Departmental Statutory Committees. In spite of reservations, the Department of Political Science has contributed to the framing of the syllabus for pedagogical reasons. The Departmental Council is seriously concerned about the implications of this for the Masters programme in the University Departments.'
