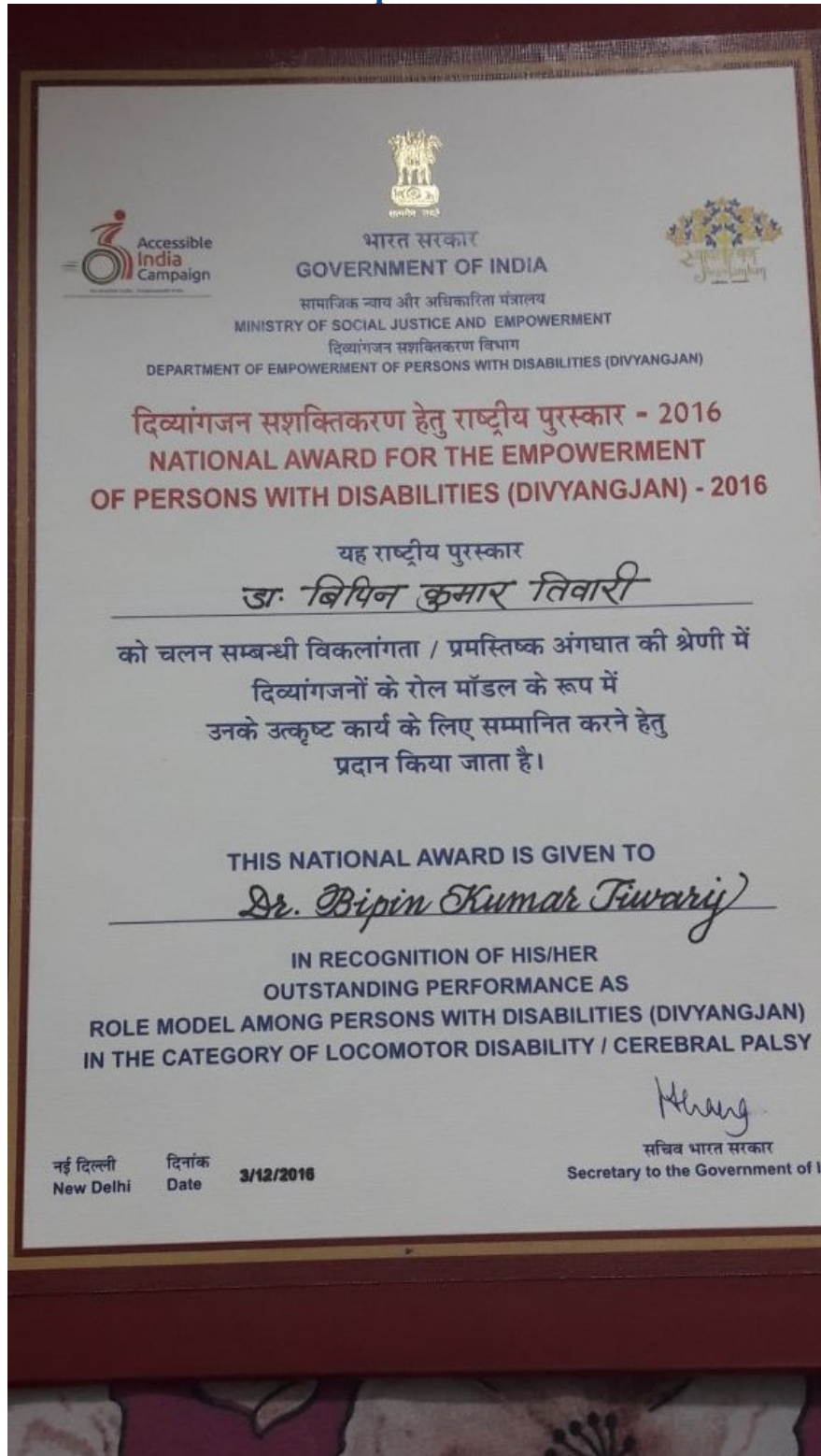

Abstract

The history of the social sciences and humanities is intimately connected to the history and experience of Empire. This semi-plenary explores the prospects for a new international imagination, reflecting on the socio-political legacies that could/should inform international thought(s) in the future. We ask whether the colonial legacy can be transcended through the cognitive frameworks it has produced; what new frames of seeing informed by local histories can help us confront global challenges; how 'European' thought has redefined itself as one such local perspective, if at all, in post-colonial times; and what the history of local knowledges tells us about the limits and potential transformations of our disciplines.

Navnita C. Behera biography

Navnita Chadha Behera is a Professor of International Relations at the Department of Political Science, University of Delhi. She was also held Visiting positions at University of Uppsala, Bologna, the Central European University, The Brookings Institution and University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Her principal current research focus is on

understanding the politics of knowledge production in International Politics and exploring varied geo-cultural epistemologies, both historical and contemporary, for theorizing in this domain. She also maintains an interest in International Relations of South Asia specially issues of war, conflict, political violence and international security.

ISA TASK FORCE ON THE GLOBAL SOUTH

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Governing Council of the International Studies Association (ISA) at its meeting in Atlanta on March 15, 2016 unanimously approved the setting up of a presidential task force on the Global South. The following topics have been identified as starting points to be considered by the task force:

- **Subcommittee 1:** *Issues of ISA Membership, Participation in ISA Conferences, Journal Publication, Funding, and Workshops*
- **Subcommittee 2:** *Specific Regional/Country Challenges, Possible Contributions in terms of ISA Participation*
- **Subcommittee 3:** *Long-range Issues: Scholarship, Scholarly Engagement and Mutual Understanding of Scholars from Global South and Global North*

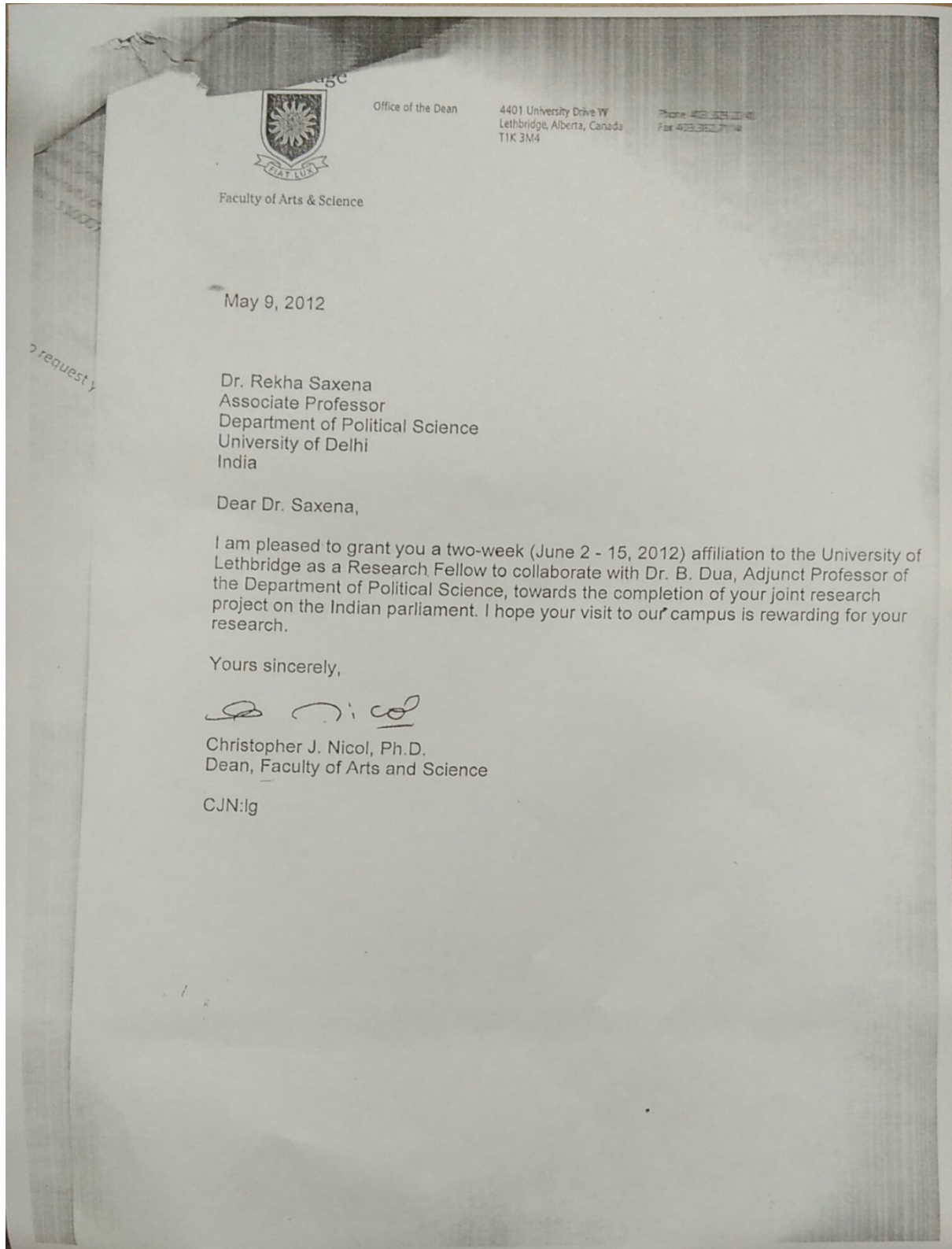

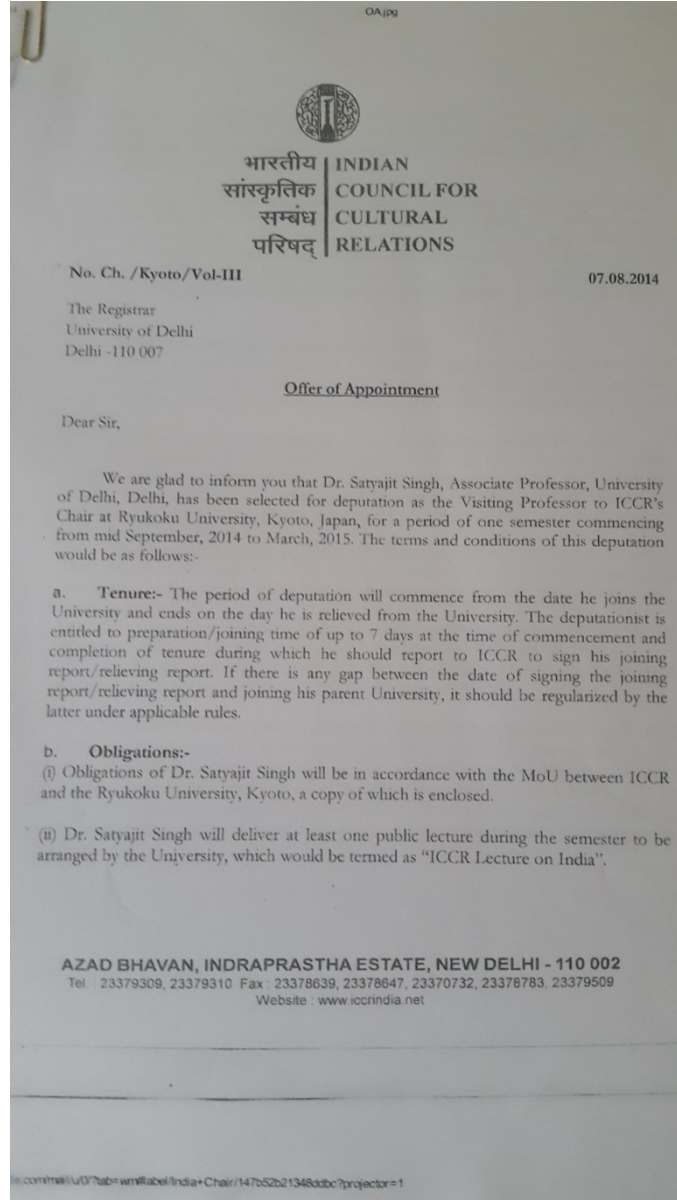

(iii) **Conduct and performance:** - The Visiting Professor will abide by the host University's code of conduct and human resources policies and laws of the country of deputation. He will be governed by the provisions of IFS (Conduct Rules) & CCS (CCA) Rules during the period of deputation to ICCR.

(iv) **Employment of Spouse and Family members:** - The spouse of Dr. Satyajit Singh and dependent family members if residing with him shall not accept any employment in Japan, on payment basis without prior permission of the ICCR, who will consider such proposals only if recommended by concerned Mission/ Post and in consultation with the Ministry of External Affairs, when necessary. (Note- All expenditure on accompanying spouse and family members will be borne by Dr. Satyajit Singh himself.)

c. **Pay & other remuneration payable by ICCR :-**

i) During the period of deputation, Dr. Satyajit Singh will draw from the relevant Mission/Post the same basic pay and grade pay as is being drawn by him in the present scale of pay in parent organization, with annual increments to the next higher stages in the scale.

ii) No other allowance, including deputation duty allowance, will be admissible.

iii) The Quantum of Additional Allowance admissible will be determined on the basis of the country of deputation. The Quantum of Additional Allowance once fixed, will remain unchanged for the duration of the deputation and will not be affected by any revision of pay scales/grade pay on account of annual increment, promotion or grant of ACPs or any other factors.

iv) Further, the Quantum of Additional Allowance will stand reduced to the extent of any honorarium being paid by the University under the MoU with ICCR, excepting the amount of honorarium being allocated to payment of rent and health cover as laid down in the MoU.

v) The Pay and other admissible allowance and their drawal during home leave or any other leave will be regulated in terms of relevant provisions of IFS (PLCA) Rules.

vi) Dr. Satyajit Singh will not accept any other remuneration other than as provided in this letter and in the enclosed MoU while on deputation to ICCR.

d. **Pension/Provident Fund:** - During the period of deputation, Dr. Satyajit Singh will continue to be governed by the rules of the University of Delhi, Delhi, relating to the pension/provident fund etc. The Mission/Post will remit employers subscription to the provident fund by RBI drafts through deduction from the monthly salary bills to his parent institution under intimation to the ICCR. ICCR will pay only pension contribution for his deputation period, if the service of the deputationist is covered under the pension scheme.

c. **Leave: -**

- (i) During the period of deputation Dr. Satyajit Singh will be entitled for 2 ½ days earned leave for each completed month of service and a maximum of 8 days casual leave in a calendar year. For lesser periods of deputation, casual leave would be calculated proportionately.
- (ii) Any additional leave requested and granted by ICCR to Dr. Satyajit Singh will be treated as extraordinary leave without pay.
- (iii) Grant of leave will be regulated in terms of relevant provisions of CCS (Leave) Rules.
- (iv) The leave request should be routed through the relevant Head of Mission/Post to ICCR.
- (v) He will not apply for any kind of leave to the parent institution/University in India and will not carry over any credit of un-availed leave on return.

f. **Passage & Baggage Allowance:-**

- (i) Dr. Satyajit Singh will be provided to and fro international air passage by the cheapest economy class and shortest route for himself only and 100 kgs unaccompanied baggage allowance exclusive of free baggage allowance provided by the airline.
- (ii) The return passage will be available only on completion of assignment.
- (iii) Dr. Satyajit Singh is not entitled for any other passage to India or any other destination at the cost of ICCR during the entire period of his deputation. ICCR will not bear any expenses related to premature return of Dr. Satyajit Singh to India under any circumstances.

g. **Other facilities to be provided during the stay of the Visiting Professor abroad :-**

- i) Accommodation, medical care, office space and other facilities will be on the basis of the MoU signed and letter of Exchange agreed between ICCR and the Ryukoku University, Kyoto, Japan.
- ii) Where the university is not responsible for providing either accommodation or medical coverage, the same would be the responsibility of ICCR.
- iii) Where the university is responsible for medical coverage, ICCR will not be liable for any additional medical expense over and above what is being provided by the University/Institution.
- iv) Where ICCR is responsible for medical coverage, ICCR shall reimburse actual medical expenditure as provided in the AMA Rules applicable to Govt. servants posted abroad, with the proviso that ICCR shall not provide any assistance for any disease/ailments/health problems from which the Visiting Professor was already suffering at the time of joining in ICCR.
