
Dear Professor Choudhary:

Dear Prof. Choudhary:

As you know, the Kavli Institute for Theoretical Physics in Santa Barbara is organizing a program entitled *Present and Future Neutrino Physics* that will take place during the period September 29 – December 19, 2014. This program will bring together experimentalists and theorists at a crucial moment in the study of neutrinos: the dawning of precision lepton flavor physics. The program will be coordinated by Graciela Gelmini, Danny Marfatia, Thomas Weiler and Walter Winter, with Sandip Pakvasa serving as a scientific advisor. An associated conference will be held from November 3 - 7, 2014. Further details on both activities may be found on our web site: <http://www.kitp.ucsb.edu/activities/dbdetails?acro=neutrinos14>.

After consultation with the coordinators, I would like to invite you to participate in the program for the period November 3, 2014 to November 23, 2014. (Please note that November 27-28 is the Thanksgiving Break, an observed holiday, when there will be no regularly scheduled activities at KITP and when no staff will be present. In general, participation often falls off by Wednesday if not sooner, as some people leave for various destinations to be with friends or family. In addition, it is the heaviest travel time of the year in the U.S., so airline reservations are difficult, and discounts are rare. Nov 28-Dec 1, or a subset thereof, is a blackout period.) Assuming that you will be sharing lodging with Prof. Pascoli, we will reimburse you for living expenses up to a maximum of \$75/day.<sup>1</sup> We will not be providing any salary or honorarium.

Our travel budget is very limited. We ask that, if at all possible, you supply travel costs between your home institution and Santa Barbara from your own resources. However, if this is impossible, you can explain why and apply for travel support from KITP, using the online application form at <http://www.kitp.ucsb.edu/travel-request>.

If, however, at some point you find that you are having difficulty accepting because of financial strictures, for example because you will be accompanied by family members, please contact the Deputy Director to see whether KITP may be able to provide further assistance. We attempt to facilitate long-term visits within the limitations of our budget and regulations. Families with children coming for four weeks or longer are eligible for supplementary assistance from the KITP Family Fund.

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<sup>1</sup> U.S. tax laws and University of California regulations require that reimbursements for meals not exceed \$60.00/day, and that lodging and all other expenses beyond \$60.00/day be documented by original receipts. If you are not a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, it is imperative that you bring your passport and have either the proper status (W-B) or proper visa (usually a B-1 or a J-1) in order to be reimbursed by the KITP. If you will have a visa (J or H) issued by another institution, please contact Timber Kelley at [myvisit@kitp.ucsb.edu](mailto:myvisit@kitp.ucsb.edu) for instructions.

For your reference, I am providing below a link to important information concerning what you must do before coming to KITP plus a link to a listing of some of our administrative staff who assist in arranging visits and supporting visitors. You may wish to bookmark these links for future reference. If you will not have medical insurance coverage applicable to your stay here, please contact Timber Kelley for further information.

I would greatly appreciate learning from you promptly (no later than Sunday, February 16) if you will be able to participate. In your response, by e-mail to [myvisit@kitp.ucsb.edu](mailto:myvisit@kitp.ucsb.edu), please let us know explicitly whether the proposed dates are acceptable. Because of space and financial limitations, any significant change in the duration or time of your visit requires consultation with the coordinators and with us. This includes changes that would result in your participation for less than the whole period for which you are invited.<sup>2</sup> We look forward to an exciting and productive research program.
