## Schedule of payment:

- 1. Tuition fee and other charges to be paid at the time of admission.
- 2. Examination fee has to be paid at the time of admission.

Note: Teachers of the University/Colleges and students enrolled in other Department of the University who have paid the Tuition fee shall pay a tuition fee of Rs. 90/- per annum. They must submit a certificate signed by the Principal of College or Head of the Department together with the receipt of payment of fee to the University. In the case of Ph.D. students this certificate will be required only at the beginning of the term for which concession is claimed. They will pay only the Annual fee.

### VIATTENDANCE

The Department expects the students in language courses to attend at least 75% of the total classes failing which they may not be allowed to sit for the examinations. M.Phil. and Ph.D. students must attend the Seminars held in the Department and participate in them.
