

June 18, 2012- July 1, 2012

b) Outline the scientific activities you conducted while in Japan (e.g. experiments, discussions, research trips)

Following invited talks were delivered during the visit from June 18,2012 to July 1,2012

1. " Operator space projective tensor product" University of Tokyo, on June 20,2012.
2. " An introduction to the operator space tensor product" University of Gunma on June 22,2012.
3. " Recent results on operator space projective tensor product" Chiba University on June 30,2012.

Operator space projective and injective norms are the analogues of the Banach space projective and injective norms, which serve as the greatest and the least operator space tensor norms, respectively. However, there is an interesting and useful tensor norm, namely, the Haagerup norm on the tensor product of two operator spaces which has no counterpart in the Banach space theory, and which has a variety of applications in the theory of operator spaces and completely bounded operators.

Since its discovery, the operator space theory has played a significant role in the development of non-commutative harmonic analysis including Fourier algebras, group C^* -algebras and von Neumann algebras.

The main goal of this visit is to discuss the rich structure possessed by the operator space projective tensor product, which deserves further attention than what it has received in the past. Properties like $*$ -regularity, F-property, spectral synthesis, symmetry of this Banach $*$ algebra were discussed. Joint work on Schur tensor norm will continue. This will help students in India specially in Delhi University working in this area to pursue research.

c) If you have published any papers during your stay in Japan , list them and the names of the journals. Attach a copy of each paper, if available.

Discussions were held with Prof. Itoh, Gunma University. Research work is in progress but at the moment is at preliminary stage. Two weeks time was too short to finalize a research paper.

- d) **Give your impression of the present state of science in Japan and your general impressions of Japan.**

I could meet and discuss with well known Mathematicians like Prof. Kawahigashi, University of Tokyo, Prof. Itoh, University of Gunma, Prof. Tomiyama and Prof. Nagisa, Chiba University. We had discussions on the talks given by me and has resulted in many open problems. General people are nice and helpful. The visit was very well arranged.

Exchange visit may be allowed more. Continuing joint work requires visit of Prof. Itoh to University of Delhi and possibly another visit of two weeks next year or so.



Nandini Sundar holds degrees in philosophy, politics, economy, and anthropology. She has researched and published on social and political marginalization in India. 
